Life Coach (Bridge Housing)-South LA

Pay: \$17-20/hr, commensurate with experience (Full time)

Organization: Sanctuary of Hope (SOH) is a nonprofit that provides education and housing stabilization services to Transitional Age Youth (TAY), ages 16-25, who are homeless, foster care, or at-risk in South Los Angeles and South Bay. SOH helps youth and young adults build self-reliance by helping them overcome poverty, trauma, low educational achievement, unemployment, and lack of well-being.

Summary: The Life Coach builds and fosters healthy relationships and assists with helping youth build resiliency while in Bridge housing. S/He provides life coaching and coordinated case management services with housing navigators to address multiple complex needs and reduce barriers, including referrals to SOH programs and/or other community resources.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provide on-site life coaching and support services applying strengths-based, Positive Youth Development, and consumer-centered approaches.
- In coordination and conjunction with housing navigator assist with housing stability plan and placement.
- If without an attached housing navigator, develop a housing stability plan to establish goals and action steps toward stabilization, independent living, and self-sufficiency in conjunction with the youth.
- Ensure that youth retain and maintain linkage with housing navigator that may be a service provider outside of SOH.
- Help youth develop permanent connections in their lives to strengthen their support network.
- Assist youth in identifying and accessing services necessary to reach long-term housing goals.
- Utilize personal vehicle, in good working order, to transport youth to appointments when necessary.
- Meet with youth bi-weekly (more often when needed and less as youth matures in their goals), to monitor progress and /or barriers toward achieving their life aspiration goals.
- Provide crisis intervention as needed.
- Help youth identify and find housing options including assisting with completing housing and credit check applications.
- Coordinate follow-through services with YCES, SYCES, FSC, and attend coordinated care meetings as assigned by supervisor.
- Perform recordkeeping and reporting of program activities on electronic reporting systems (Social Solutions, HMIS, etc.) for outcomes and evaluation; and complete progress notes and program-related reporting as required.
- Report issues and problems to management.
- Attend weekly staff meetings.
- Perform other duties as may be assigned by the Area Director.
- Comply with contract and goals and outcomes.



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- Arrange work schedule or required hours to the benefit of the Department/Program with the approval of immediate supervisor.

Qualifications:

- Demonstrated experience in working with at-risk youth to reach their housing, employment, or education goals
- Proficient in Microsoft Office applications
- Excellent written and oral communication. Proficient in math.
- Demonstrated experience in one or more of the following areas: mental health, chemical dependency, emotional/behavioral special education, at-risk youth issues
- Demonstrated knowledge of and ability to work effectively with youth with a variety of identities, cultures, and backgrounds including ethnic/racial minorities and LGBTQ youth
- Knowledge of Trauma-Informed Care and Practices a plus
- Ability to pass drug screening
- Ability to work collaboratively, but independently
- Ability to pass a criminal and child abuse index background check
- Reliable transportation and clean DMV record

Certificates, Licenses, Registrations:

- Valid California Driver's License and proof of auto insurance
- Adult CPR & Basic First Aid
- TB Test Clearance
